

PLAY DOUGH PROJECT


Great fun!

Beautiful results and no expense! What you will need: dough (2 cups flour, 1/2 cup salt, 3/4 cup water); rolling pin, knife, cookie sheet and foil; water-base paints and plastic or enamel sealer (or acrylics); segments from metal coathangers; and monofilament (fishing line).

Knead the dough, form a ball and roll out onto a 1/4 inch' slab. Design and cut-out bird or other shapes (removing excess dough). Put a hole in the center top of each shape for hanging purposes. Place shapes on foil-covered cookie sheet. Moisten tops with water-filled "mister" for best results.

Cook in 350 degree oven until shapes are puffy and barely golden (do not brown).

When cooled completely, add colors and finish off with a sealer (polimer or enamel glazes in spray cans are your best bet).



Carefully balance and hang shapes from rod-part of coathanger (or driftwood or dowling) using monofilament (it doesn't rot).

There you have it – a beautiful and lasting mobile for any young bird fancier's room \bullet
